Colon (:)	Colons can be used to: 1. Introduce a list 2. Before speech marks 3. To add extra information	LIST: She glanced at the list of rules: no talking, no pets, no friends allowed – great! BEFORE SPEECH MARKS: The angry mob chanted: "Out! Out! Out!" TO ADD EXTRA INFORMATION: The dragon looked absolutely livid: blood red and foaming at the mouth.
Semicolon (;)	A semicolon is used instead of a conjunction to link two related sentences.	l must revise; l have an important test tomorrow.
Parantheses	Parentheses are used to add extra information. They can be in the form of: 1. A pair of brackets 2. A pair of commas 3. A pair of dashes	BRACKETS: The stately manor (built in 1627) was in need of a major overhaul. COMMAS: Upon eating the cookies, all thirteen of them, Ella felt ill. DASHES: After returning to school - from her holiday - she worried about all the homework she had missed.
